Headteacher's Message:

Dear Parents/ Carers,

I hope you and your families are keeping well?

As the Government continue to impose further restrictions to manage the pandemic nationally, the message for schools is really clear; we must remain open and continue to do all we can to keep the members of our school communities safe and well. At St John Vianney School, we are continuing to work through our reopening plan and push hand hygiene and social distancing messages in all we do. We are thankful, that to date, our immediate school community remains COVID free and a safe environment for all the children, staff and visitors. It is a challenge in having to work differently each day, but the children are responding to the changes we have to put in place in a really cooperative and considerate way. Thank you for your continued support in getting children into school each day. Their attendance at school has ensured that they are not falling behind in their learning.

Next Thursday, October 1st is our remote 'Welcome Evening'. We have, as explained previously, needed to postpone the opportunity to welcome you into school next week, but are setting up a series of remote activities for you to get out key messages and for you to meet

(virtually) with class teams. On Monday we will send you 2 short presentations that we would have used on Thursday evening. One will be from myself and the other from the Key Stage Coordinator responsible for your child's Key Stage in school. These presentations will give you information about the school and our new routines and show how you can help us get the best out of your child's experience this year. On Thursday the team of staff will remain in school from 3.30pm-5.00pm and are available for a telephone conversation with you, should you request one. This will be an opportunity to speak to you individually about how your child has started the new term and answer any questions you wish to pose. Can I ask please, that if you wish to have a 'one to one' call with the class teacher/team that you call the Admin team on 0161 881 7843 on Monday or Tuesday and they will set up an appointment time for your call. Thank you for your support in this and I hope the presentations we send you find useful.

We will of course look forward to welcoming you back into school when we are able to do so. Please ensure you read through the mid-week information we sent this week which includes; the Wednesday Word, an information letter on 'Zones of Regulation' and a letter from Public Health England on testing for the Coronavirus.

Should you have any queries or issues please contact the staff Admin team and we will respond as quickly as possible. Best wishes for the weekend and the week ahead.




