### Meet our Careers Advisor

Since qualifying in 1993, I have worked as a Careers Adviser in schools, colleges and sixth forms across Greater Manchester. I have also worked as a Duty Adviser with young people needing support with employment, education, training and personal issues. For the past 20 years I have worked for Trafford local authority.



In St John Vianney School I work with the careers co-ordinator, SENCO and careers team to provide information advice and guidance to young people in KS3 to KS5 and to support the school's careers education programme.

Careers delivery across the year groups includes group work, class talks, vocational guidance interviews and action planning.

There will be college, supported internship and training provider visits and careers events in school. There will be help and support with Post 16 and Post 19 applications, interviews and transition days.

I attend annual EHCP Review meetings from KS3 to support young people and their parents and carers at key transition points -liaising when needed with educational and training organisations, local authorities and support services to ensure the EHCP needs are met and each young person makes a smooth and supported transition into education, training or learning.


Just a couple of the amazing display boards the students have worked so hard to put together this week. Well done!








# The **ZONES** of Regulation®
