Dear Parents and Carers,

The impact of the Coronavirus is still being felt across our communities and in school we have had a challenging week, with a significant number of staff who are isolating. I am hopeful the summer break in 2

weeks time will help bring infection rates back down and provide us with the security to plan for the autumn term, without many restrictions. It is clear from guidance we are receiving that we will need to bring back regular testing in school if pupils are to be able to remain in school after being deemed a close contact. We are beginning our preparations around this logistical challenge and we will provide more details before we restart in September.

Please remember that School closes for the summer break on Friday July 16th at the earlier time of 1.30pm. We have informed transport teams of this earlier finish. We reopen for the new academic year to pupils on Tuesday 7th September at 9.00am.

Staff are finalising reports and we hope to have these out to you next week. We are using a new format, which we feel provides a better overview of your child's achievements and we do hope you feel they reflect well on your child.

Children will be told their new class teachers for September next week also and we will transition all pupils to new rooms and staff on the final day of term, when we also welcome our new pupils who will be transitioning to SJV for the autumn term.

A busy end to the year for us all at School, but one we hope will prepare our community for the changes and challenges that will face us all in September.


Our Catholic School


Privacy Settings on Social Media Sites
