On Monday this week we welcomed our children and staff back into school after the autumn half term break; I do hope that you and your families managed to have a rest during the week holiday? The staff and pupils certainly look refreshed, after a week away from school.

We have a number of staff who have been off this week isolating at home and we look forward to welcoming them back early next week. Their absence has posed a challenge

in terms of covering their roles, but the staff in School have been really flexible in their work and we have managed to continue to deliver the full curriculum and enrichment activities to all classes this week, which we are very pleased with. The children have been fantastic this week too and have supported the staff in their engagement and their participation in all activities this week. Thank you for getting them ready for being back in school this week; your support is really appreciated.

We have seen a significant increase in Coronavirus cases in the South Manchester area over the last few weeks, so we are continuing to ask children to socially distance (where possible) and practice good hand hygiene, particularly after transitions in school. We are all anticipating another busy 7 weeks before the next break.

If you must have fireworks at home, please follow this safety advice.

## DOs (



- Only buy fireworks from retailers registered with MFRS
- Keep fireworks in a closed box
- Follow the instructions on each firework
- Light them at arm's length, using a taper
- Stand well back
- Always supervise children around fireworks
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves
- Keep pets indoors

## DON'Ts 🔀

- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks
- Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them
- Never give sparklers to a child under five
- Don't let fireworks off after 11pm

Class 1 have enjoyed making biscuit fireworks and breadstick sparklers while learning about bonfire safety. *Miss Walsh* 





Class 2 showing great concentration during Maths this week! Mr Wood






