We have had another very busy week in school. The children have had lots of activities to engage with and their participation and involvement in all aspects of the schooling continues to impress us all.

On Wednesday, the Chaplaincy team had their 'retreat' at the Spiritan Centre in Salford, with Father Desmond. The chaplaincy team, at school, has over 30 pupil members and Mrs Garfin and her team of staff use the opportunity to team

build with the group and to involve our children in the preparation for Advent services and activities. I'm informed that the children were really well engaged and made excellent contributions to the planning. Mrs Garfin reported that the team of pupils were all excellent ambassadors for the School. Well done to all those involved.

Many of our children are avid readers of his work and to be able to see a production of his most popular book was a real treat. Another great experience for our children, which I hope will encourage more reading at home.



This weekend moves us into Advent; a time of the year that we really look forward to in School. We will be doing our upmost to prepare the children to understand the real meaning of Christmas and prepare fully for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. We hope that you will continue these conversations with your children at home.

Class 10 have been looking at World War II and in particular the subject of "rationing". They were lucky enough to be able to see some genuine ration books.








Actual Ration Books





Class 3 have had another amazing session at the farm. They have helped get the hen house ready for the chickens to use.










Class 9 have been making rain gauges this week in maths. We are going to see how much rain they collect over a week.













Class 1 had lots of fun listening to The Gingerbread Man and acting it out with stick puppets. Our favourite part was decorating and eating our very own gingerbread men.
