

Stars of the Week


Each week a 'Star of the Week' is chosen by the class team to celebrate achievements both academic and pastoral.




In their Enrichment lesson this week, Class 2 enjoyed learning how to play card games.





Class 7 learned some useful skills in their Design Technology lesson this week. They made tortoises with mechanisms!











No Nonsense Here! Class 4 enjoyed reading poetry this week. They particularly enjoyed Michael Rosen's Book of Nonsense.










A number of young people in Class 12 took part in their first work experience day at King's Road School. They thoroughly enjoyed their time and were great ambassadors for St John Vianney School.






Class 9 made some beautiful poppies this week while reflecting on Remembrance day. They enjoyed handing them out to their peers and staff during assembly in our Chapel.






Using their artistic skills this week, Class 8 have been drawing and acting like Saints so that their peers could guess which Saint they were portraying. Fantastic work all around.

Getting an autism diagnosis as a young adult can be a moment of huge significance. On one hand it can feel like finally getting answers to questions about yourself, or feelings of difference from others. But an autism diagnosis can also raise many more questions that need answering.



Lots of young people understandably want further information and support to understand their diagnosis. Yet, we know from speaking to young people that this advice can be hard to access.



#### So, you're autistic?

Ambitious Autism Youth Network decided to create resources for young autistic people like themselves. Their collection of videos and blogs, all written or featuring autistic young people themselves, explain diagnosis, autistic identity and everything that surrounds it.

They have divided the videos based on different experiences; getting diagnosed as a child, as a teenager and as an adult. We hope that there will be an experience that resonates with everyone, wherever you are on your journey.
