



A message from our Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

I do hope you and your families are a keeping well.

Attendance to School has continued to improve since the first week of January and this has allowed us to ensure a wide range of activities can be planned for, for our pupils.



I do hope you like the format of the School newsletter and that it continues to keep you up to date and provides you with a good understanding of our offer at SJV. It is usually my last read on a Friday afternoon and it certainly makes me smile when I am able to see the many happy and content pictures of our pupils and the vast range of activities they encounter in a typical SJV week. We really are blessed with opportunities that our children can engage with. This week we have had pupils attend the Children's Adventure Farm Trust for Forest School and Work-related learning, Ten-Pin Bowling in Parrswood for PE lessons, Cronkshaw Hall Farm for animal welfare activities, Gorse Hill Studios for media work, Greater Manchester Outdoor Learning for Duke of Edinburgh and Preparation for Adulthood activities. Ants in Your Pants for play sessions, Stretford Leisure for swimming lessons and to Longford Park for PE sessions and other enrichment activities. We are really proud of this offer and our pupils participation, which certainly helps bring learning to life for many of our children and young people. Additionally, it was great to see pupils staying behind for extracurricular activities again on Wednesday evening.



The KS3 and 4 groups are starting to plan for their Residentials at Bendrigg and the Calvert Trust in the Lake District. These take place in the final week of February for KS4 and the week 7th - 11th March for KS3. Mr Dumville and Mr Donovan have now forwarded the details to parents and I know the pupils are very excited about these excellent team building and outdoor education opportunities, that we provide.



During the next 2 weeks we have KS4 and 5 classes visiting the Hideout Zone in Gorton. This will provide each pupil with an excellent opportunity to identify local community facilities, which provide out of school experiences, at little cost for pupils with SEND. More of these facilities are being built by local authorities to engage with young people in their home communities. We hope the visits will provide our pupils with opportunities to further their independence and build upon relationships in their local areas.

K-leum - For an improved week and handling changes well!


Shea - Having excellent attendance and joining in with group activities

Joe - For improved behaviour and attitude to learning.


SJV Class News



Class 3 enjoyed playing group games with the parachute at the park. We visit Longford Park during Independence and Enrichment on Wednesday afternoons.








Class 7 had a great time playing with the kin-ball during their PE lesson. They worked really hard as a team when trying to keep the Kin-ball off the ground.








Class 8 have gone Uno mad with nearly the full class joining in our games in our social time.





Class 9 are learning about the solar system in Science this half term. They have been making their own model solar systems this week.


















Class 12 have been cleaning windows and learning how to vacuum, in their Preparation for Adulthood lessons. Well done everyone.

Autisms App was created as a resource for anyone looking for apps for people diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder. Downs syndrome or other special needs. Many people are discovering the many uses of IPads, iPhone and IPod touches have tools and resources for people diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder. Autism App links to extensive reviews of apps written by parents, specialists and other users usually from first-hand experience. Autism App also has links to video demonstrations or reviews of the apps when they are available.



Have you heard about The Bread and Butter Thing?

TBBT makes life more affordable for people on a low income, builds stronger communities and reduces food waste using an innovative and self-sustaining approach to the redistribution of surplus food and non-food items.

TBBT provide weekly groceries at the fraction of the high street prices through their membership scheme. They will try to provide you with some fruit, veg and something for your cupboard and fridge.

A typical order is three shopping bags, one of fridge goods, one of cupboards goods and one full of fruit and veg, this costs ± 7.50 .

They also accept Healthy Start vouchers.


