



# A message from our Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have had a good week?

This week has been further disrupted by additional staff and pupils who have tested positive for coronavirus. We are not the only school organisation to be affected by an increase in Covid rates in the last few weeks and we are doing all we

can to ensure that our pupils, staff and the wider school community are as safe as possible in School. Fortunately, none of the staff or pupils who have tested positive are very poorly and most are able to return to school after eight days. It has however provided a logistical challenge in School and we have relied on the flexibility of our staff team to make sure we have full coverage for every class, each day in School. If your family have been affected by the recent coronavirus outbreak, I do hope you are all keeping well.

Those pupils who have been School have settled quickly to their routines after the disruption of the residentials in the two week previous and have been very supportive in dealing with the absences we have faced.

We are now halfway through this half term and we are busy preparing for the second interim report of the academic year. Staff are currently compiling the pupil reports and we hope to have them out by the end of March. Reports will be sent prior to the 'parents evening', which we have booked in on April 7th from 4pm in School. This will be a fantastic opportunity for parents to attend School and to find out from class teachers the progress that children have made this year to date. We look forward to welcoming you into School. We are also preparing some short workshops on that evening, that parents can choose to attend, to give you further information about our work in School. Further details will be sent to you in the forthcoming weeks.

We are currently advertising for a new Assistant Headteacher and a new Teacher of English; if you know of any qualified teachers who may be interested in either position, please ask them to contact the school office for further details.

A reminder please; should any family requires any financial support to ensure their children are fully able to access all

elements of education at SJV, please do contact School and we will do all we can to offer any support. This may be to provide school uniform, household groceries or access to opportunities for the child in the local community. If you would like to discuss this further please contact Mrs Griffin, our Family Liaison Officer, through the School office. Mrs Griffin will be happy to discuss these needs confidentially with you and we can work together to identify how the needs can be met.

Benjamin - For having an excellent week. Also gaining a volunteering job outside out school.


Daniel - For increased, clear speaking in class and around school.



On Wednesday we walked to Morrisons' in Chorlton and all the pupils chose their own magazine.




















Class 1 have been learning all about St. Patrick's Day this week. We have celebrated by trying to Riverdance, painting shamrocks and making our very own leprechaun hats.


